
World Health Organization on Tuberculosis Statistics

World Health Organization declared TB a global emergency in April 1993, when TB was the leading cause of death worldwide, with eight million new cases and three million deaths every year.



Approximately one quarter of the global population had latent TB infection.





In 2019, tuberculosis (TB) was still one of the top 10 causes of death worldwide, and a leading killer of HIV-infected people.

In 2019, 10 million people fell ill with TB worldwide, and 1.4 million died from the disease (including 208,000 people living with HIV).
